The Salvation Army Youth Creative Council (YCC) - Southwest Music and Arts serves as a dynamic platform for young individuals to actively participate and shape the future of Music and Creative Arts within the Southwest Division. This initiative is not only a testament to our commitment to youth involvement but also an integral part of our mission to nurture Christian leaders, foster community bonds, and sustain innovative and relevant programs.

Purpose and Mission

Membership Composition

The YCC will operate under the guidance of the Southwest Divisional Music Director, Marlon Jones.

Eligibility Criteria

- Age: 14-25 years.
- Status: Active Salvation Army Soldier or Adherent in good standing.
- Approval: Application endorsed by respective corps officers.
- Skills: Demonstrated artistic/musical talent in their respective fields.

Membership Terms

Members commit to a minimum of one year, with expectations to attend all quarterly meetings, barring exceptional circumstances. Failure to meet these requirements may impact their position in both the YCC and associated Territorial groups. Notification of absence should be communicated to the Divisional Music Director at least 24 hours in advance. Missing more than one meeting annually is discouraged.

Roles and Responsibilities

- Active Participation: Engage in discussions, sharing opinions and perspectives.
- Respectful Interaction: Listen attentively and respect diverse viewpoints.
- Constructive Feedback: Offer insights on various programs, events, and resources.
- Broad Perspective: Consider topics beyond personal experience.
- Articulate Communication: Effective written and verbal expression of ideas.
- Event Participation: Support and attend various divisional events as needed.



Staff Facilitation

The YCC will be facilitated by two dedicated staff members, responsible for overseeing operations, ensuring smooth meeting conduct, and advocating for the council's objectives.
